#### **Grant: Harold Mitchell Foundation**

**You must be a charitable organisation with Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) Status to apply for this grant**

**Purpose:** To sponsor vital projects or activities in the Arts and Health that would not otherwise happen without assistance.

**Overview:** A project or activity only in the arts or health areas, which

- Creates discovery in the arts and or health fields to break new ground and set up opportunities for the future.
- Increases the capacity of communities to foster their arts and health activities and the capacity of talented individuals with the commitment and potential to improve our world.
- Enables establishment of arts or health activities with real potential to take off and be ongoing

#### **Limitations:**

Applications can not be accepted from any of the following organisations or for any of the following categories:

- For-Profit bodies and commercial/business entities
- Political Parties
- Private Schools
- Sports Clubs
- Organisations outside Australia
- Requests for retrospective funding
- Requests for capital works (although projects for capital fit-out requirements can be considered)
- Fundraising, public appeals or loans
- Contributions to the corpuses of other foundation trusts or not-for-profit organisations.

The Foundation can only accept applications from individuals where they have a confirmed auspice or funding partner.

The auspice must have the appropriate ATO endorsements as described previously (TCC and DGR) and your project will need to be equivalent or similar to their field of activity or business.

**Who can apply:**

Organisations seeking consideration of funding must be endorsed as both:

1. a Tax Concession Charity or TCC (formerly ITEC - Income Tax Exempt Charity); and
2. a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) to be eligible for consideration.

**Grant: Register of Cultural Organisations**

**Provider:** Dept of the Environment, Water, Heritage and the Arts

**Category:** Arts & Culture

**Funding:** Indirect Tax Deduction for donors to donate **Closes:** Ongoing

**Purpose:** To assist qualifying cultural bodies to attract support by enabling them to offer donors the incentive of a tax deduction.

**Overview:** The Register aims to strengthen private sector support for the arts and encourages Australians to contribute to the nation's vibrant cultural life. Cultural bodies listed on the Register are able to receive tax deductible donations to assist them with a wide range of activities, such as the creation of a new theatrical work, the publication of a literary magazine or the building of a community arts centre.

**Limitations:** Public art galleries, museums and libraries are not included on the Register as they are approved by the Australian Taxation Office under another Deductible Gift Recipient category.

**Who can apply:** Cultural bodies eligible for listing on the Register are those whose main purpose is the promotion of a cultural activity such as: literature; visual, community, performing or Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander arts; music; crafts; design; television; video; radio; film; or movable cultural heritage.

**Grant: CBOOnline Grants - Satellite Reception Equipment**

**Provider:** Community Broadcasting Foundation Ltd

**Category:** Arts & Culture

**Funding: Max per grant:** \$1,500

**Closes:** Ongoing

**Purpose:** To enable community radio stations to purchase satellite reception equipment to access the community broadcasting satellite program distribution channels: the Community Radio Network, National Indigenous Radio Service (NIRS) and RPH Australia service.

**Overview:** You can apply for:

- up to \$1,500 to cover the cost of purchase and installation of a satellite dish, and/or
- loan of satellite reception equipment: a receiver/decoder, balancing amplifier and smartcard

What can we use the grant for?

- Your station must use the satellite equipment primarily to access community radio content from the Community Radio Network, National Indigenous Radio Service or RPH Australia satellite services.
- You must rebroadcast a minimum average of one hour per week of community radio satellite programming.

**Limitations:** Grants are not available for stations broadcasting under a Temporary Community Broadcast License (TCBL) or narrowcast license.

**Who can apply:** A community radio station with a long-term or a temporary licence.

**Grant: Digital Delivery Network Infrastructure Grants (DDN) Grants****Provider:** Community Broadcasting Foundation Ltd**Category:** Arts & Culture**Funding:** The DDN Player computer is provided as a grant of equipment. The estimated total value of the DDN Player package is in excess of \$5,000.**Closes:** Ongoing**Purpose:** To provide equipment (DDN Player package) for community radio stations to access the DDN.**Overview:** The Digital Delivery Network (DDN) uses a data stream linked to the Community Radio Network satellite channel to deliver data directly to station-based computer equipment via the station's satellite receiver. The DDN enables:

- online ordering, automated recording and storage of Community Radio Network satellite programs for later replay
- distribution of audio, image and text files via data casting e.g. AMRAP music releases
- easier access to, and exchange of, small audio items such as serials and CSA's.

Funds are available to provide equipment (DDN Player package) for community radio stations to access the DDN. The equipment is to be supplied via the Community Broadcasting Association of Australia as DDN Project Manager.

**Limitations:** Grants are not available to stations broadcasting under a narrowcast licence. A station with a temporary licence must have been on air for at least two years cumulatively prior to applying.
