The Rudd Government delivers \$26.5 million to 10 Primary Schools in the South in first round of P21 funding

Federal Member for Kingston, Ms Amanda Rishworth announced that 10 primary schools in Kingston will share \$26.5 million for major new infrastructure projects under Round One of the Primary Schools for the 21st Century (P21) program.

“Today’s announcements will further strengthen the Labor Government’s education revolution for future generations,” Ms Rishworth said.

“This money will not only lead to improvements in schools but will also support local building and construction jobs generating employment opportunities for local trade workers” stated Ms Rishworth.

Ms Rishworth welcomes the fact that five of the ten southern schools will invest in multipurpose halls benefiting both the schools and surrounding communities.

“Many of the multipurpose school halls will support out of school hours care (OSHC) programs and adult learning and recreational groups providing a community hub for the local residents” Ms Rishworth said.

The P21 funding program will deliver the following funding to schools in the South

- Aldinga Primary \$3 million
- All Saints Catholic Primary School \$2.5 million
- Antonio Catholic Primary School \$2.5 million
- Christies Beach Primary School \$3 million
- McLaren Vale Primary School \$3 million
- Moana Primary School \$2.5 million
- Reynella Primary School \$ 3 million
- Seaford K-7 campus Port Noarlunga \$2 million
- Seaford Rise Primary School \$3 million
- Sheidow Park Primary School \$ 2 million

“This is another big step in delivering the Building the Education Revolution, a key element of the Government’s \$42 billion Nation Building – Economic Stimulus Plan” Ms Rishworth said.
