Partnership Gives Three Southern Adelaide Schools Access to Performing Arts and Media Centre

Students in the southern suburbs of Adelaide will have access to a state-of-the-art performing arts and media centre, thanks to \$2.5 million in Australian Government *Local Schools Working Together* funding.

Federal Member for Kingston, Amanda Rishworth MP today opened the centre at Aberfoyle Park Primary School Campus.

Ms Rishworth said “I am delighted that local students here in the South will benefit from these fantastic facilities.

“Projects like this one demonstrate that this Federal Government is working towards ensuring local students in our community have the education and training opportunities they need to reach their full potential.”

Seeing the centre first hand, Ms Rishworth was impressed with the possibilities for students at three schools to undertake innovative learning activities at the new centre.

Ms Rishworth said “Aberfoyle Park Primary School Campus comprises Pilgrim Primary School, Thiele Primary School and the School of the Nativity. These three schools worked together to build a centre all the students could make the most of.

“The new centre includes a state-of-the-art performance and media centre housing a 250 seat theatre, a music classroom, a media hub with computers, a sound house and three suites for individual music tuition.”

The Local Schools Working Together pilot program encourages government, Catholic and independent schools to work together to develop shared educational facilities, with \$62.5 million made available towards the construction of 26 shared facilities nationwide.
